- Offered for adults, ages 18+
- Women - Tuesday evenings, 7pm-9pm
- Men - Wednesday evenings, 7pm-9pm

16 Week Phase 2 Co-ed Groups:

- Offered for adults, ages 18+
- Men and Women, Monday or Thursday evenings, 7pm-9pm

1 Day Partners Workshop & Bi-Monthly Drop-in Support Group:

- Offered for adults, ages 18+
- One (1) day workshop offered for support persons and CSA survivors
- Bi-monthly 2-hour drop-in for support persons (non-CSA survivors) connected with CSA survivors attending Gatehouse groups

10 Week Visual Arts Groups:

- Provided for CSA survivors, ages 18+
- Monday evenings, 7pm-9pm
