Our Vision: A future where those impacted by childhood sexual abuse can heal and reclaim their voice.

Our Mission: To provide supports, resources and advocacy on behalf of those impacted by childhood sexual abuse.

Objectives: Provide a range of formal and informal supports and outreach. Mobilize community capacity, strengths and skills of volunteers. Increase service capacity through collaboration and partnerships and facilitate creation and transfer of knowledge.

The Gatehouse Adult Support Program:

The Gatehouse peer led Adult program's primary focus is to enable survivors of child sexual abuse to develop and maintain positive life skill strategies. It teaches skills focusing on building healthy relationships, boundaries and an overall hope to continue living a successful and meaningful life. The Gatehouse group structure is designed to facilitate social-reconnection, education and self support. The Gatehouse strongly believes in the need for community support in the aftermath of child abuse.

In 2011, 64 adults went through The Gatehouse 15 week program

The Gatehouse Child Investigation Program

The Gatehouse provides immediate and ongoing support to children and families going through the investigation process. The Gatehouse offers a child friendly location 24 hours a day 7 days a week, where Police officers and child welfare personnel can interview children and their families during child abuse investigations.

Message from the Chair

2011 saw the Gatehouse build on the stabilization process created in 2010.

Through the efforts of the Board, we built on the strengths of 2010 and have created the following programs:

- Adult Program Phase 1 15 weeks for men and women
- Adult Program Phase 2 8 weeks co-ed
- Young Adult Group Drop-in Age 18 to 24
- Young Adult Program (age 18 24) -10 weeks for men and women

In this past year, we have developed and facilitated three adult peer support training programs.

We developed and hosted our second annual Transforming Trauma into Triumph Conference. This conference brought together adult victims of sexual abuse along with internationally renowned professionals, community agencies, and community members all with a focus on celebrating and creating new approaches to address the issues adults face when victimized by sexual abuse.

We provide students from college and university the opportunity for to engage in field placement activities.

We continue to engage in community awareness initiatives addressing adults victimized by childhood sexual abuse.

We are currently designing our web site to be interactive for adults seeking immediate support in relation to issues of sexual abuse.

We were featured on Global Television "Making a Difference." We have been interviewed by CBC on the issues dealing with childhood sexual abuse.
