MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR SABRA DESAI, MSW, RSW



The Gatehouse is located within the traditional and treaty lands of the Mississaugas of the Credit. Known as Adoobiigok [A-doe-bee-goke],the "Place of the Black Alders" in Michi Saagiig [Mi-Chee Saw-Geeg] language, commonly known as Etobicoke.The region is uniquely situated along the Humber River Watershed, which historically provided an integral connection for Anishinaabe [Ah-nish-nah-bay], Haudenosaunee [Hoeden-no-shownee], and Wendat [Wine-Dot] peoples between the Ontario Lakeshore and the Lake Simcoe/Georgian Bay regions. Now home to people of numerous nations, Adoobiigok continues to provide a vital source of interconnection for all.

At The Gatehouse, as you all know, our values include community, connectivity, compassion, and relationships, as such we express our gratitude to Indigenous Peoples, for making it possible for us all to share this land and commit to taking the responsibility of the co-stewardship of the land seriously. June is National Indigenous History Month, we commit to acknowledging, not only in June, but throughout the year the rich heritage and diverse First Nations, Metis and Inuit Peoples cultures. While acknowledging Indigenous cultures and contributions, we would be remiss to not recognize the ongoing impact of intergenerational trauma, the loss of children and generations to the brutal residential school system. At The Gatehouse we acknowledge and commit ourselves to honouring the struggles of Indigenous Peoples, by supporting the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission as well supporting the calls for justice by the families of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, and fighting against anti-Indigenous racism.

I am delighted to have an opportunity on behalf of The Gatehouse to reach out to all of you particularly as we are continuing to provide services remotely at this time. The pandemic has given many of us a chance to step away from our hectic lives, but it has also exposed our fragility and vulnerability as well as amplifying many injuries and injustices in our midst. But it has also showed how we can adapt, and most importantly our connectivity for example At the Gatehouse we have continued to provide peer support groups via zoom. At the societal level continue to witness a global response to racial, sexual and social injustices.

MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MARIA BARCELOS, MA, BA

2020 saw a year of rapid transition and progress for The Gatehouse as we continue to achieve many successes on behalf of survivors of Childhood Sexual Abuse (CSA). Since March 2020, all peer support group programs transitioned to virtual spaces, including adapting peer facilitator training workshops for online service delivery. The Gatehouse offered more than 50 peer support group programs in 2020 and introduced a 5-week self-care program as a response to the pandemic's negative impact on mental health experienced by survivors.



We continue our partnership with Full Circle Art Therapy Centre to provide art therapy programs for adult survivors. Renovations to The Gatehouse basement for art therapy, office, and storage purposes were postponed and will continue when public health restrictions allow us to do so.

The Gatehouse was not able to host our annual Healing the Voice Within fundraiser this year due to the pandemic. We are grateful for the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy program that provided financial support, the tremendous support of our individual donors and corporate donors including Mackenzie Charitable Foundation, LiUNA Local 183, The Blue Tie Ride, for their generosity and support. We could not do this work without you.

The Healing garden and the Labyrinth continue to provide spaces of healing, peace and hope to the community. Thank you to Lloyd and Diane for your continued support in gardening.

The Gatehouse, with the incredible support of our student team, continues to reach out to community organizations to inform them about The Gatehouse programs, impart wisdom, and instill the importance of self-care. The continued development in the key areas of adult programs, peer facilitator training, and transformational learning processes will remain a core competency of The Gatehouse. Throughout the pandemic, The Gatehouse continued to be a safe space for children and families to receive support from the Catholic Children's Aid Society of Toronto through our partnership.

The Gatehouse continues to provide students from college and university the opportunity to complete field placement experience hours from various colleges and universities with over 200 students completing a practicum since 2012.

The Gatehouse Board Members, donors, volunteers, and staff at The Gatehouse are truly saving and transforming lives.
